Primary Physical Education and Sports Premium

What is the Sports Premium?

The government has announced that it is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers. The money must be used to improve the provision of P.E. and school sport. On 6th February 2014 the Prime Minister, David Cameron committed to continue the funding for the Primary PE & Sport Premium until 2020.

Purpose of funding:

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer. The funding should ensure:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

Possible uses for the funding include:

- Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- Run sport competitions
- Increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- Run sports activities with other schools

Aims for the PE Sports Premium at Temple Grove Academy:

P.E and school sport play a very important part in the life of Temple Grove Academy. We believe that P.E and school sport contribute to the holistic development of our children and through participation, our children build and learn more about our key values.

The P.E leader at Temple Grove Academy has worked hard with the leadership team to develop a strategic plan for using the government's additional sports funding to ensure sustainable provision through the improvement of facilities and an investment in staff training.

We aim to:

- Provide increased opportunities for all children regardless of sporting ability.
- Increase opportunities to compete in local and regional tournaments.

- Access to resources and training to improve the quality of teaching and learning in physical education.
- Promote school values through sporting activities.
